Jack Grover has been named the Boys Water Polo Program Head at Harvard-Westlake School.

Grover comes to Harvard-Westlake from the UCLA Men's Water Polo program, where he was an assistant coach. In addition to coaching for UCLA, Grover was responsible for scouting and video analysis of opponents and led UCLA's recruiting. Grover was a key member of the coaching staff that helped UCLA win the NCAA Division I Championship in 2020.

Prior to his three seasons coaching in the Pac-12 with the Bruins, Jack was a standout player for UCLA, helping them to win three NCAA Division I National Championships between 2013-17. Grover represented the United States at the World University Games in 2015 and was named an NCAA Academic and Honorable Mention All-American in 2017. He graduated UCLA with a Bachelor of Arts in history and played professionally in Spain for a year for Club Natació Catalunya.

"We are excited to welcome Jack as our new Program Head for Boys Water Polo," said Terry Barnum, Head of Athletics. "Our boys program has developed a long tradition of excellence and we believe Jack is the right person to lead our program to continued success."
